West Franklin Boulevard Rehabilitation Project Traffic Advisory West 85th Street to West 25th Street (Wards 3 & 15)

New Closer for West 48th Street and West 38th Street

CLEVELAND – Beginning, Monday July 10th, The Perk Company will close Franklin Blvd. at the intersections of West 48th Street and West 38th Street. The West 45th street intersection will remain open to all traffic.

Electronic message boards and advanced warning signs will be placed to notify the motoring public. Detours will be placed at W 50th Street to the West and W 32th Street to the East. Traffic will be directed North to Detroit Ave.

Local access only signs and barricades will be placed at these intersections. Access will be maintained for residents at all times. Physical construction will be limited to the removal and replacement of intersection pavements at W 48th and W 38th which will be closed.

Project Description:

Work generally consists of resurfacing approximately 2.0 miles of West Franklin Blvd. From West 85th St. to West 25th St. Work includes milling of existing asphalt and replacement, along with full depth repairs, utility casting adjustments, ADA compliant curb ramps and landings, and pavement markings and signage. Work also features traffic calming measures including mini-roundabouts at West 74th Street, West 58th Street, West 54th Street, West 58th Street, West 54th Street, West 55th Street, West 48th Street, West 45th Street and West 38th Street. Construction is to be completed in September 2023.
